Member Spotlight: Sierra Sanchez from Grant Haliburton Foundation presented. The Grant Halliburton Foundation was established in 2006, after Grant Halliburton, who was diagnosed with bipolar disease committed suicide. Benita, his mother realized she was never educated in suicide signs and wanted to establish a foundation to help prevent suicide, promote better mental health, and strengthen the network of mental health resources for teens and young adults. Grant Halliburton Foundation provides education, conferences, collaboration and encouragement. Last year the foundation reached over 21,000 kids. The have 3 annual conferences; Windows to Hope, Beyond Bullying which is Sat., Aug. 15th for a half day for 15\$ and 3 CEUs, When Life Hands You Teenagers on Sept. 20 for 65\$ in Plano. They also provide 2 support groups for parents; Coffee Days which occur once a month for dads and three times a month for moms. They also run the 'I Am Here Coalition.' The Grant Halliburton Foundation also has an, online database, "Here for Texas," a mental health resource database online with free access. This database asks specific questions to help give you the best resources as possible. Some classes offered include suicide prevention with services 6th graders-college, Rise: Change Your World- kinder and up, the cost for an entire day at a school is300\$ inclusive of materials and Title 1 and churches are free.
